BIOGRAPHY

BRIGADIER GENERAL KEVIN A. HUYCK **Deputy Chief of Staff Operations**

Brig. Gen. Kevin A. Huyck is the Deputy Chief of Staff Operations at NATO's Headquarters Allied Air Command, Ramstein Air Base, Germany. In this capacity, General Huyck is responsible to the Chief of Staff for all operational related matters, including Air Policing, Ballistic Missile Defense, Article 5, and Crisis Response Operations. He is also responsible for ensuring HQ Allied Air Command is prepared to establish an operational AOC if required for an emerging Contingency Operation.

General Huyck is a 1990 graduate of the U.S. Air Force Academy and earned his wings at Sheppard Air Force Base, Texas. He was a Distinguished Graduate and Instructor at the USAF's Weapons Instructor Course and attended National War College. His assignments include F-22 Initial Cadre, F-22 Follow-on Operational Test and Evaluation, director of operations, and combat Joint Staff, commanding at the squadron, group, and wing level.

General Huyck is a command pilot with more than 3,000 flying hours in the F-15 and F-22, and 295 combat hours in support of Operation Southern Watch.

Prior to his current assignment, General Huyck served as Commander, 1st Fighter Wing, Air Combat Command, Joint Base Langley-Eustis, Va. He was responsible for the worldwide rapid deployment and employment of F-22 air dominance fighters in support of combatant commander taskings.
